Directions to Chico Hot Springs: From the C'Mon Inn take I-90 East for 31 miles to the second Livingston, Montana exit, 333 (Yellowstone National Park exit). Turn left at the light at the end of

the off ramp. You are now on highway 89 traveling south. Travel 23 miles on highway 89 to the flashing yellow light located at Emigrant, Montana; turn left and travel 1.2 miles to the stop sign and turn left. Travel .5 miles and turn right onto the Chico road. Chico Hot Springs is located 1.6 miles at the end of the paved road.

Directions to 320 Guest Ranch: Take Hwy 191/87 north out of West Yellowstone. Stay on 191 as it winds through a corner of Yellowstone National Park (look for bison, elk and moose in the area) for a total of 36 miles. At mile maker #36, turn right at the 320 Guest Ranch entrance.

Overnight at 320 Guest Ranch (Check-in time: 4 pm Check-out time: 10 am)

5 – 8 pm Dinner at the 320 Guest Ranch is western style, on the deck of the restaurant, featuring a pig roast (pulled pork) rolls, potato salad, baked beans and coleslaw. (Your first beer or soda is free.) During dinner, live country / country –western music is played for entertainment. This is a first come, first served meal.
